Denmark powered by The Femern Belt Corridor: Regional Development Perspectives

The tunnel project connecting Denmark and Germany across the Baltic Sea will be finished 2020. It is a large infrastructure investment, which represents the third phase in the ongoing integration of Scandinavia and the European continent (the first was the Storebælt link and the second was the Øresund bridge). Elimination of the land-sea barrier and a substantial decrease in travel time Copenhagen-Hamburg will open up for new interaction and will create a “real” Danish-German border region. The project will be set in context (transport, logistics, business, research), and potential new regional development will be highlighted in the presentation.
