An expert in U.S. Constitutional law, Dr. Fisher currently works for the Library of Congress and previously (1970-2006) was with the Congressional Research Service (CRS), providing expert research assistance to members of the U.S. Congress. He is the author of numerous scholarly articles and books dealing with national security and the separation of powers, including *The Constitution and 9/11: Recurring Threats to America's Freedoms* (2008); *Military Tribunals and Presidential Power: American Revolution to the War on Terrorism* (2005); *Nazi Saboteurs on Trial: A Military Tribunal and American Law* (2d ed., 2005), and most recently *On Appreciating Congress: The People's Branch* (2010).

Dr. Fisher has been invited to testify before Congress on many issues, including government war powers, state secrets, and surveillance. Working with CEELI (Central and East European Law Initiative) of the American Bar Association, the CRS, and the International Bar Association, he has also assisted with constitutional drafting and other legal matters throughout Eastern Europe and elsewhere in the world.
