#### **Session Details**

### **Changing Political Economies: Macro Trends and Micro Experiments**

In economic and political debates, it is widely assumed that in the last 25-30 years major changes have occurred in the political economies of the second postwar settlement. It is also assumed that these changes can largely be understood as a process of liberalization designed to strengthen the role of the market in governing economic activity in the face of a number of general trends challenging the previous order.

Opinions diverge, however, as to the characteristics and dynamics of the overall process. Against popular convergence theories, empirical research apparently indicates that, beneath the surface of similar major discontinuities at the macro level, the directions and the results of change can differ even dramatically at lower levels, where more or less purposive experiments and unexpected but inventive reactions may take place. The innovative role sometimes taken on by local governments and local-level actors in promoting original labor-market and industrial policies, or the multiform initiatives, often at territorial level, aimed at reconfiguring the employment relations and/or revitalizing the role of the trade unions, are but examples of these experimental attempts at readjustment and innovation.

The outcomes are contrasting processes of change, exhibiting divergent developments at the macro and micro levels, which still need to be satisfactorily investigated and interpreted. The conference will focus on the social and economic transformations occurring at various levels, with particular attention to the interplay between these levels and to the distinct processes of change that may derive from it.

### **Economic Flexibility and Social Stability in the Age of Globalization**

The theme of the SASE 2008 meeting is suggested by Karl Polanyi's *The Great Transformation*. Polanyi interprets the history of industrial society in the 19th and 20th centuries in terms of a pendulum-like "double movement." One side of that movement is toward free and flexible markets that underpin, and in some sense foster, the material and technological gains associated with the Industrial Revolution. The other side is a reaction to the disruption that these markets impose on people's lives, an attempt to preserve the social relations through which people understand themselves and find meaning in their lives.

The current era of globalization mirrors that of the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries in many ways. Markets are being established, liberalized, and deregulated throughout the world. Goods, finance, and people are moving within and across frontiers at an ever-accelerating pace. And people are bewildered, looking for alternatives to their increasingly chaotic and insecure lives.

Furthermore, the reaction emerging today recalls the politics and policies of the Great Depression and the immediate postwar period, when the second half of Polanyi's double movement came into effect. But with one critical difference: While the theories that have guided deregulation and globalization in the closing decades of the 20th century are the direct descendants of the laissez faire ideas that guided globalization a century ago, the philosophies that informed the second half of the double movement—that is, the social legislation that grew out of the Great Depression—have in many ways been discredited. Today's reaction is therefore more instinctive and visceral than deliberate and considered, and the question is whether it will indeed be possible to reconcile these two movements in theory or through practical politics.

We will examine the prospects for reconciliation in a series of panels on the contemporary relevance of four major social and economic theorists: Marx, Keynes, Polanyi, and either Habermas or Weber. A fifth panel will specifically explore the possibility that these older social theorists have been rendered obsolete by new technologies, especially information networking, which, if true, would call for new understandings of economic development, north-south relations, and the relationship between the economy and the society.

The practical dimension will be explored through papers and panels drawing on grounded research on specific industries and geographic areas and devoted, where possible, to innovative approaches to critical markets (for labor, capital, raw materials, and the like). Special attention will be focused on the reaction against neoliberalism and the Washington Consensus in Latin American countries; to parallels in other countries and regions of the world; to the economic roots of that reaction; and to changes in economic and social policy that have emerged as a result not only in the region but throughout the world.

To explore the interaction between scholarly theory and political practice, we draw on the Latin American tradition of combining public service with careers as intellectuals and academicians. Óscar Arias, the Nobel Laureate and current President of Costa Rica, is one of the most prominent representatives of this tradition. He will also be the keynote speaker at the meeting. SASE will invite a group of prominent Latin American politicians with similar backgrounds to join him as panelists and discussants in roundtables with each other and with the academic participants.

## Featured Speakers

**Gosta Esping-Andersen** is Professor of Sociology at Universitat Pompeu Fabra and has previously taught at Università di Trento, the European University and at Harvard University. His research centers on social inequality, demographic issues, and the welfare state. He is the author of *Three Worlds of Welfare Capitalism*, *Social Foundations of Postindustrial Economies*; and *Why We Need a New Welfare State*.

**Ritt Bjerregaard** is the Lord Mayor of Copenhagen. She was elected to public office for the first time in 1970, when she entered local politics in Denmark's third largest city of Odense. The following year she was elected a member of parliament. She quickly proved herself an unorthodox and highly independent politician, early on challenging the establishment in Danish politics and in her own party. After only two years in parliament she became minister for education. Ever since, she has had a dominant position in Danish politics. She has served as minister four times, and in 1995 she was appointed commissioner to the European Union for the environment. She re-entered national politics in 1999, once again elected to parliament. In 2005 she returned to local politics in Copenhagen, where she now is Lord Mayor. Ritt Bjerregaard has led the political debate on issues later called "new politics". She is especially known as an advocate for environmental issues, women's rights, education, and social politics.

**Peer Hull Kristensen** is Professor in the International Centre for Business and Politics at Copenhagen Business School. His main interests concern the distinctive nature of work organization, skill formation and sub-contracting relationships in different national business systems, the implications of these differences for the organization of multinational firms, and the role of trade unions inside multinational firms. His most recent book (with Jonathan Zeitlin) is *Local Players in Global Games: The Strategic Constitution of a Multinational Corporation*. Edited books include *The Multinational Firm: Organizing Across Institutional and National Boundaries* (with Morgan and Whitley), *Governance at Work: The Social Regulation of Economic Relations* (with Richard Whitley), and *The Changing European Firm* (with Richard Whitley).

**Patrick Le Galès** is Directeur de recherche CNRS at CEVIPOF, (Centre de recherches Politiques de Sciences Po) Professor of Politics and Sociology, at Sciences Po in Paris. He was educated at Sciences Po Paris, and then got an M.Litt in politics at Nuffield College, Oxford, a Ph.D. in Sociology at the Univ Nanterre Paris X, and an Habilitation at Univ Rennes. His main fields of research are comparative public policy, (France, UK, Italy, Finland), governance, urban sociology, political economy/economic sociology. He currently works on middle classes in European cities, the restructuring of the British state, corruption and governance in the Paris region, and the instruments of public policies at the national and EU level (part of the NEWGOV Project). He was a Stein Rokkan Prize winner for the book *European Cities, Social Conflicts and Governance*. He published or edited *Politiques urbaines et développement local en France et UK* ; *Les réseaux de l'action publique* ; *Regions in Europe, the paradox of power*; *Cities in contemporary Europe* ; *Local industrial systems in Europe, rise or demise ?* ; *The Changing Governance of Local Economies in Europe* ; *Developments in French Politics 3* ; *Gouverner par les instruments*.

**Ruth Milkman** is Professor of Sociology and Director of the Institute of Industrial Relations at the University of California, Los Angeles. She did her undergraduate work at Brown University, and received her M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of California, Berkeley. Her research and writing has ranged over a variety of issues surrounding work and labor organization in the U.S. She has written many articles and four books: *Gender at Work: The Dynamics of Job Segregation During World War II*; *Japan's California Factories: Labor Relations and Economic Globalization*; *Farewell to the Factory: Auto Workers in the Late 20<sup>th</sup> Century*; and, *L.A. Story: Immigrant Workers and the Future of the U.S. Labor Movement*.

**Jonathan Zeitlin** is Professor of Sociology, Public Affairs, Political Science, and History at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He is also Director of the Center for World Affairs and the Global Economy (WAGE), and the European Union Center of Excellence. His current projects include a cross-sectoral analysis of the new architecture of experimentalist governance in the EU, and a collaborative study of the globalization of component supply chains in old-line manufacturing industries (funded by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation). Professor Zeitlin is Co-Editor of *Socio-Economic Review*, published for SASE by Oxford University Press. Recent publications include: *Local Players in Global Games: The Strategic Constitution of a Multinational Corporation* (co-authored with Peer Hull Kristensen), *The Open Method of Coordination: The European Employment and Social Inclusion Strategies*; *Governing Work and Welfare in a New Economy: European and American Experiments*; *Americanization and Its Limits: Reworking US Technology and Management in Postwar Europe and Japan*, and "Supply Chain Governance and Regional Development in the Global Economy," a special issue of *Industry & Innovation*.
