Global Supply Chain & Logistics Management

The tri-continental programme Global Supply Chain & Logistics Management – GLOBAL for short - was initiated in 2016 as a collaboration between the university partners CBS, Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shenzhen (CUHK-SZ), China and University of British Columbia (UBC) in Vancouver, Canada.

The mission statement of the program is to cultivate students' knowledge of supply chains, logistics and related theoretical foundations to create value in the global economy. The program develops conceptual thinking, strategic perspective, quantitative focus and analytical acumen, combined with multi-cultural understanding through a tri-continental learning experience. We aim to cultivate cohorts of successful leaders who, through developing, communicating and implementing innovative solutions will improve world integration.

The students spend their third semester in Copenhagen, their fourth semester in UBC, Vancouver and their fifth semester in the new Shenzhen campus of CUHK. In the final, sixth semester a GLOBAL Internship takes place. The programme will introduce students to potential internship hosts in the logistics industry and beyond. Further, the final semester is dedicated to the bachelor thesis where also global logistics and SCM topics may be included. Each of the three universities select 15 talented students, creating a global cohort of up to 45 students. The CBS students will be selected in the spring semester based on an application process. Grades, interview performance, and not at least personal motivation and achievements are important selection criteria. The programme is only open to CBS students from the BSc programmes in International Shipping and Trade, and International Business.
