

JOURNAL LIST 2019

The purpose of the publication list is to communicate key characteristics of the department's publication activities and specify a list of important research outlets for the department. This list is an update on the 2012 version and is formulated on basis of the past 6 years of publication practice and discussions at the department.

Publication purpose and outlets

The journal list is developed to facilitate the strategic dialogue between the HoD and the Dean of Research and to inform other stakeholders about the type of research that the department is doing. Furthermore, the list also serves a role as an internal communication tool to express our identity as department.

The journals on the list are included because they exemplify the type of research that we do as a department. They are journals that are topical for us because they specialize in the phenomena that we study (ie. management of production and service processes, supply chains, technology and innovation and management accounting). Our research as well as the journals demonstrate the strong interlinkages between these phenomena in organizational practices. The journals on the list represent research communities that we are involved in. The journals are affiliated with the research conferences and associations that we participate in and are part of. Furthermore, faculty members of the department serve in their editorial boards.

The OM journal list exemplifies the type of research that the department is directed towards. The journals are listed in a 'topic-order' so the numbering of the journals give no indication of their relative importance for the department.

The OM journal list is indicating an ambition of the department and is not meant to be exclusive. In addition, we keep an annually updated list of the other journals and books that are important outlets for our research. These journals are either similar in kinds to the ones on the OM journal list or more general management journals. Here, we acknowledge different career stages and the likely progression of junior faculty towards high ranked outlets.

Publications are one out of five elements in REEAD and for considerations about recruitment, promotion and bonuses of individual researchers, publication is complemented with other criteria. In regard to publication, the number of publications highlights a ‘quantity’ of work but in order to understand the ‘quality’ of work, assessment of the *content* of work is most important. In addition, we also consider other indicators such as journal rankings, (e.g. AJG list and Citescore rank quality) and impact factors.

Implementation of the strategy, including quantitative measures

To help us continue and develop our publishing culture and pursue the strategic ambitions, we will employ the following tools and activities:

- Organize publications activities, e.g. by holding regular publishing seminars for faculty
- Facilitate feedback on pre-submission papers at the department’s research seminar series
- Invite editors from the OM12 list to department seminars for “tips and clues” and exchange of paper ideas.
- Announce publication options for junior faculty, focusing on publishing in selected journals and books from distinguished publishing houses.
- Encourage and prioritize paper presentations at the department’s target workshops and conferences
- Develop departmental collaborations around special issues as well as regular submissions in the OM 12 journals
- Keep annual statistics of the book/journal rate and the OM12 rate
