

# The Communication, Organization and Governance (COG) cluster

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brings together a diverse group of international scholars who focus their research activities on

1. organizational dynamics, management practices, governance structures and forms of communication and discourse in both private and public organizations and
2. the variety of social, cultural, economic and/or political contexts in which these sets of activities and organizations intersect and interact, in particular global and intercultural contexts

The COG cluster involves several dozen scholars from the department of Management, Society and Communication, as well as a large number of external affiliates, who bring a broad range of theoretical perspectives to bear on the three keywords that define the cluster. These include organization theory, organizational communication, organizational behavior and leadership, business ethics and corporate social responsibility, marketing and consumer behavior, semiotics and discourse analysis, globalization theory, governance theory, and cultural studies.
