## The metrics of academic production

My list of complete publications is organized according to the Danish system of *Bibliometriske Forskningsindikatorer* or BFI (bibliometric grade), which is based on the so-called *Autoritetslister*, which is revised every year by 350 researchers across 67 disciplines. The bibliometric grade indicated in square brackets refers to the lists of the Danish Ministry of Higher Education and Science. **Level 2** designates 20% of publishers, which are "considered undoubtedly leading by the internal research environment in the field", whereas **Level 1** indicates that the journal is ranked as "normal outlet"<sup>1</sup>.

My citation index in Google Scholar currently stands at **almost 100**, which is considered high for an early career scholar.
