

Competence profile for BSc in International Business and Politics

After completing the IBP programme the successful graduate should be able to:

- Identify, analyze and evaluate problems related to interactions between businesses, national and international political institutions, and non-governmental organizations, using theories and methods from business studies, economics, political science and international political economy.
- Identify and develop recommendations for action and strategy formulation, thereby supporting and contributing to management and leadership functions in business and other organizations whether in the private or public sectors.
- Present analyses and recommendations succinctly and in a well-reasoned manner
- Participate in and manage work-groups for the successful implementation of the stated strategies, and
- Co-operate and communicate successfully with people of different professional backgrounds (law, economics, management, political science, sociology).

The academic environment and the courses that collectively constitute IBP are international in character. Issues of sustainability and inequality are addressed across much of the programme. Participating students not only acquire the skills and competencies identified above but also a mature independence and commitment to cooperative, team-based forms of working.
