The backbone of my research consists of my contribution to clarifying how concepts and practices impact cultural and social organizing. The engagement of/by civil society in the way we conceptualize “the common good” has significant implications for how we address and solve the grand challenges of our day. However, as my research until now has indicated, the conceptualizing of what is civil action (and where to find it), as well as the intertwining of expectations for the future and understandings of the past, have substantial impact on how people organize (temporalize) the present and diagnose the future. I work from an interdisciplinary approach, bridging organizational, historical, moral, legal, political, and economic domains. My research spans from contributing to contemporary discussions of civil society, “the common good”, and philanthropic gift-giving practices to more theoretical and methodological discussions pushing the relational-processual approach forward.
