## SUMMARY

Mitchell Dean is a political and historical sociologist and social and political theorist with an international research reputation in these areas and management and teaching research experience across the humanities and social sciences. He has held Professorships in Sociology at Macquarie University, Sydney, and the University of Newcastle, and has been Professor of Public Governance and Director of Politics Research at the Copenhagen Business School for the last five years. He gained his PhD in 1988 at the University of New South Wales.

Dean has over one hundred academic publications, including in prestigious journals in Europe, Britain, Australia and North America. He is the author of seven books in English, including the highly cited *Governmentality: Power and Rule in Modern Society* (Sage 2010, 2<sup>nd</sup> edition). This book has the distinction of being quoted in the Oxford English Dictionary entry on government and having been cited in the first editions of Foucault's lectures on governmentality in French and English. It has been translated into Danish, Russian and Persian. Dean has most recently published *State Phobia and Civil Society: the Political Legacy of Michel Foucault* (with Kaspar Villadsen, Stanford UP, 2016) and was the editor, with Barry Hindess, of the first national collection of studies of governmentality (*Governing Australia. Studies in Rationalities Government*, Cambridge University Press, 1998). His PhD was the first Australian sociology PhD to be published by an international publisher as *The Constitution of Poverty: Toward a Genealogy of Liberal Governance* (Routledge, 1991).

Dean has had extensive teaching experience in sociology at all levels of curriculum. He has successfully supervised eight PhD students, been on the examination committees of more than twenty others, and is currently supervising three PhD students. He now teaches 'Theories of Contemporary Societies' on the Bachelor of Sociology and Business program and 'Power and Communication' and 'Method and Analytical Strategies' on the Master of Political Communication program. In 2018, he designed and taught with Stefan Schwarzkopf what is believed to be the first PhD course in economic theology. He has received invitations and given lectures and seminars at universities in London, New York, Paris, Jerusalem, Manchester, Tübingen, Amsterdam, Bayreuth, Oslo, Helsinki, and Lund, as well as many others, including those across Australia and Denmark.
