As a PhD Fellow of Cross-Cultural Management at the Department of International Economics, Government and Business, I am conducting research on bicultural talent management with a focus on Japan. Prior to my doctoral studies, I was a teaching assistant professor and later a teaching associate professor of Japanese. I have been engaged in the Japanese language education at CBS since 2009, and had the overall responsibility for coordinating, developing and teaching the Japanese courses offered by the undergraduate program International Business in Asia. As such, I have developed and taught at all eight Japanese language courses, four of them pioneering at CBS to use online or blended learning as a teaching tool. I am also the academic director of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test hosted annually at CBS. I hold an MA in Japanese and Scandinavian Culture Studies from Aarhus University and have 4 years of working experience from the film industry in Spain and as a freelance translator from Japanese into Danish. I spent one year on exchange at International Christian University in Tokyo, Japan, during my undergraduate years, and completed Advanced Spanish diploma at University of Seville, Spain (2006-2007).
