- Themes included generational divides in opinion formation, the role of family ties in political behaviour, inter-generational solidarity, and inter-generational mobility
- Capabilities and communicative skills evaluated to 4.6 by the students (5 = highest)

# Methods 2, Department of Political Science, University of Copenhagen

Fall 2022

- I taught classes of approximately 40 undergraduate students each and graded exams. The course is a mandatory part of the bachelor programme
- The course centered around quantitative methods and topics included OLS regression, logistic regression, interaction models, multi-level modelling, experimental research design, and panel data estimation

#### Methods 3, Department of Political Science, University of Copenhagen

Spring 2022

- I taught classes of approximately 40 undergraduate students each and graded exams. The course is mandatory and the last methods course on the bachelor programme
- The course consisted of both advanced quantitative and qualitative methods including causal inference, panel data estimation, regression discontinuity designs, and discourse analysis

- I taught weekly classes of 40 undergraduate students each, carried out workshops in applied methods and statistics, and graded three rounds of assignments
- The course is a introduction course to both quantitative and qualitative methods and a mandatory part of the bachelor programme
